As an individual and a member of the Guard, you can fulfill this role as long as you have an attitude of respect, friendliness, and fairness. You will be expected to give a great deal of yourself throughout this experience, but the experience is an opportunity of a lifetime. As a Color Guard member, you are in a highly visible position and your everyday conduct becomes extremely important. You must remember that you represent the Louisville High School Marching Band at all times wherever you go and in whatever you do. Therefore, members of this line are expected to adhere to high standards of performance and character not just as a member of the line, but also during their academic and personal life.

Color Guard is fun and will be one of the best things you will ever do but it is physically, emotionally, and mentally demanding. You are under pressure to be your best because you project the image of Louisville High School Marching Band in and out of uniform. 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Requirements

Every girl trying out must submit a complete tryout folder by **Friday, March, 1 2019**. A complete tryout folder includes all of the following:

1. Application
2. Signed Parent consent form
3. List of 3 Teachers to whom you gave your evaluations. Teachers are to return the completed form to Mrs.Faiello or Mr. Bleininger by 3:00 on Friday, March 1, 2019 in a sealed envelope.
4. Signed Student Affirmation/Code of Conduct page

5. A \$50 deposit that will go towards the purchase of the uniform worn at halftime. The deposit will be returned if the candidate does not meet the requirements or make the team.

This is ONLY for first year members.

Failure to turn in any of these items will result in an incomplete folder. An incomplete folder is automatic ineligibility, and you will not be allowed to participate in any tryout practices or tryouts.

Time commitment

Color Guard takes a great deal of time. It can be very difficult to juggle this around other activities or commitments.

■ **Tryouts - Friday, March 8th at 3:30 p.m. in the Louisville Middle School Gym**

- Judges
 - 3 Judges will be hired by the band director. Scores from all three judges are combined for a total average score. The band directors and majorette advisor oversee all aspects of the audition, but do not score the candidates.
- Part One: Short Individual Routine
 - Each girl will draw a number. Judges will know them only by number.
 - Girls will individually perform a routine, marching and strutting for the judges.
 - The solo routine should consist of a variety of skills and multiple batons. A list of tricks to include in your individual routine is listed on the next page. These are not mandatory tricks.
 - The routine should be choreographed with music and last 2-3 minutes.
- Part Two: Short Group Routine
 - The students will perform the short routine that was taught by the majorette advisor during practices earlier in the week. This routine will be choreographed to music and use 1-2 batons. The group will perform the routine together several times for the judges.
- Dress
 - Hair secured neatly and tightly.
 - No jewelry (small earrings permitted).
 - No nail polish.
 - 2 clean, matching batons with NO caps (minimum for majorette line).
 - Athletic Clothing – navy blue shorts and white wide strapped tank top
 - ☐ Tank top (with thick straps).
 - ☐ Tights and/or socks
 - ☐ Clean twirling or dance shoes
- Results
 - Scores will be ordered from highest to lowest. It is possible for all students trying out to make the majorette line. However, we generally make a cut-off between the largest gaps in scores.
 - Candidates who wish to be considered for a Feature Twirler position must satisfy all the listed requirements, and will be selected as ability dictates. If no one of this quality is found, there will be no feature twirler.
 - Results are posted at the conclusion of the tryouts. The results are final and not open for consideration.
 - Leadership roles and Head Majorette will be chosen by the band staff on the basis of experience, skill level, academic citizenship, and leadership qualities. If no one of this quality is found, there will be no Head Majorette.

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Suggested Baton Tricks – Majorette Line

1. 2 spin catch right hand
2. 2 spin catch left hand
3. 2 spin catch back hand
4. 2 spin catch behind back
5. Vertical Finger Twirls – Twirl through 2 fingers and then back through 2 fingers in a figure 8 motion.
6. Horizontal Finger Twirl – Same as vertical, but go up and down horizontally.
7. Horizontal 2 spin catch right hand
8. Fishtails – 1 count of 8
9. 3 Elbow rolls
10. High toss Illusion
11. Showers (2 baton)
12. Variety of 2 baton tricks

Suggested Baton Tricks – Feature Twirler

1. 5 spin catch right hand
2. 5 spin catch left hand
3. 5 spin catch back hand
4. 4 spin catch on back
5. 4 spin catch blind
6. 10 Continuous elbow rolls
7. 5 Continuous neck rolls
8. 5 Continuous back neck rolls
9. Fishtail double turn into reverse fishtails
10. Horizontal 4 spin
11. High toss double illusion
12. High toss walkover or aerial
13. 2 baton
14. 3 baton

■ **After 4 practice sessions, applicants should be able to successfully demonstrate the following:**

- Fundamentals: 25 Drop Spins, Angels, Extensions, Cones, Stick Work (16 counts), Give Me Toss
 - Jazz Runs
 - Marching with roll step 8-5
 - Fight Song Routines (*Across the Field* and *Rampart*) while marking time
 - Fundamental Routine (made up of all Fundamentals) while marking time
- ****Please don't let this list turn you away. We will teach you everything.****

■ **Dress**

- All applicants must wear comfortable athletic clothing with athletic shoes.
- Hair must be pulled up in ponytail (if long enough) and pulled back out of eyes.

■ **Results**

- Results will be posted on the evening of Friday, March 8th after the conclusion of Majorette tryouts (around 6:00 p.m.). They will be posted on the window of the high school band room and the door of the middle school band room.
